Remission of fine

Bennet L. Fick of Worcester County who had been fined at the November Court of Worcester County for keeping a billiard table without license applied for a remission thereof.

The Petition was recommended by two Judges of the Court who imposed said fine on condition of the payment of seventy five dollars and seventy five cents part thereof and the payment of all costs. The said fine was accordingly remitted on the terms recommended.

November 26<sup>th</sup>

Pardon

Robert Jackson a convict in the Penitentiary for horse stealing was recommended for pardon by the Directors of the Penitentiary and was pardoned accordingly on condition of his leaving the State immediately and not returning thereto again

Joseph Walls who had been convicted in Queen Anne's County for selling liquor without license petitioned for a remission of the fine imposed upon him. The petition stated that he had taken out a license as a Tavern Keeper and was under the belief that his license authorized the sale of liquor at private places. The petition was recommended by the Court and the fine remitted accordingly on condition of the payment of the costs.

December 9<sup>th</sup>

Pardon

Jacob Wallis of Washington County petitioned for the pardon of his slave Jack who had been convicted of running away with intent to escape from servitude. It appearing that that said slave had previously borne a good character he was pardoned on condition of his master the said Jacob Wallis paying all the costs incurred by the State in the prosecution

December 10<sup>th</sup>

Pardon

The Board of Directors of the Maryland Penitentiary recommended for pardon James Burrows, who had been convicted in Baltimore City Court of grand larceny and sentenced to confinement in the Penitentiary for eleven years and ten months, on account of his being in a consumption without any probability of recovery. He was pardoned accordingly.
