February 29th

Pardon Edward Kelly who was convicted of having been engaged in the Allegheny riots was on for-
tation pardoned.

Remission of Recognizance County Court. James Ben Boyle petitioned for the remission of a recognizance in the
County Court.

It appeared from his petition and the recommendation of Cecil County Court that
he had been recognized to appear and upon making default a case had been called upon which
he was taken, tried and acquitted and that he had continued in jail under the law. The
recognizance was remitted on condition of the payment of costs.

Remission of fine Stephen Gorsuch and John Franklin petitioned for the remission of a fine imposed upon
them by Cecil County Court for selling liquor in small quantities without an ordinary li-
cense.

The petition stated that they kept a very considerable store and that if the crime
was committed while it was by their clerk during their absence. That the case had been con-
tinued for two terms at the instance of the State and that the costs had thereby been considera-
bly increased. The petition was recommended by Wm P. Maulby the Deputy Attorney General
and the fine remitted except twenty dollars paid thereof on condition of the payment of costs.
