


Known all men by these presents, That we S. S. Jackson, William Martin Bond

land are held and firmly bound unto the State of Maryland in the just and full sum of Twenty
Thousand Dollars to which payment well and truly to be made the said State or its certain
Attorney, we do hereby bind ourselves and each of us our and each of our heirs executors and
administrators jointly and severally firmly by these presents sealed with our seals this fifth
day of March in the year of our Lord one Thousand Eight hundred and forty.

Whereas the above bounden S. S. Jackson hath been ap-
pointed by the Governor and Senate of Maryland one of the Commissioners of Lotteries
of said State


Now the conditions of the above Obligation is such that if the said S. S.
Jackson shall well and truly perform and discharge the several duties required of him as a Com-
missioner of Lotteries and shall abstain from and avoid all manner of concern or interest
in the gain or loss of any lottery scheme and shall not be concerned in the purchase of any lottery
ticket or tickets, part or parts thereof and shall faithfully pay over all moneys which shall
come into his hands as a Commissioner of Lotteries to the person or persons body or bodies cor-
porate or politic who shall be entitled to receive the same and shall in all respects com-
ply with the existing laws of this State and of such as may hereafter be enacted in relation
to his duties as a Commissioner of Lotteries, then this Obligation to be void otherwise to
be and remain in full force and virtue in Law.


