The Governor of Pennsylvania

It appears by the annexed papers duly authenticated according to the laws of this State, that David Eberhart and David Beard stand charged by the officers of Samuel Knicker, Charles K. Powell, Newton S. Ely, and Norman Brown with passing counterfeit money in the City of Baltimore in this State and it has been represented to me that they fled from the justice of this State and have taken refuge within the State of Pennsylvania. Now therefore, Pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution and Laws of the United States, in such case made and provided, I do hereby request that the said David Eberhart and David Beard be apprehended and delivered to Madison Jeffers who is hereby duly authorized to receive and convey them to the State of Maryland where they shall dwell according to Law.

The Governor approves of the following bond of Michael W. Blain as Commissioner of Lotteries in the City of Baltimore.

Know all men by these presents that we Michael W. Blain of the City of Baltimore, James M. Lloyd of Talbot County and Daniel Lloyd of the same County all of the State of Maryland are held and firmly bound unto the State of Maryland in the just and full sum of Ten thousand dollars to which payment well and truly to be made to the said State or its certain attorney, we do hereby bind ourselves and each of us, our and each of our heirs executors and administrators jointly and severally firmly by these presents sealed with our seals this sixteenth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty.

Witness the above bounden Michael W. Blain hath been by the Governor and Senate of Maryland appointed one of the Commissioners of Lotteries of said State

Now the condition of this obligation is such that if the said Michael W. Blain shall well and truly perform and discharge the several duties required of him as a Commissioner of Lotteries and shall abstain from and avoid all manner of concern or interest in the gain or loss of any lottery scheme and shall not be concerned in the purchase
