The Governor approved of the bonds of William Riney as Quaper on the City of Baltimore, of David Pickett as Assistant Flour Inspector of East Beach as General Inspector of Flour of said City of Baltimore and of the bond of George Cooke as Commissioner of Lotteries - which bond is in the following words

Know all men by these presents that we George Cooke and Francis Cooke of the City of Baltimore and Wm. R. Hall of Washington County, all of the State of Maryland are held and firmly bound unto the State of Maryland in the good and full bond sum of twenty thousand dollars to which payments well and truly due made to the said State or its certain attorney, we do hereby bind ourselves and each of us our and each of our heirs, executors and administrators jointly and severally, firmly by these presents sealed with our seals this fourth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty.

Whereas the above bounden George Cooke hath been by the Governor and Senate of Maryland appointed one of the Commissioners of Lotteries of said State.

Now the condition of this Stipulation is such that if the said George Cooke shall well and truly perform and discharge the several duties required of him as a Commissioner of Lotteries, and shall abstain from and avoid all manner of concern or interest in the gain or loss of any lottery scheme and shall not be concerned in the purchase of any lottery ticket or tickets paid or paid to them, and shall faithfully pay over all moneys which shall come into his hands as a Commissioner of Lotteries to the person or persons, body or bodies corporate or private who shall be entitled to receive the same, and shall in all respects comply with the requisitions of the existing laws of this State and of such as may hereafter be enacted in relation to his duties as a Commissioner of Lotteries, then this Stipulation shall be void otherwise it shall remain in full force and virtue in Law.
