Pardon The Governor pardoned James Ferguson, John Atwell, Charles Devine, and Felix Mallon who had been convicted of being engaged in the riots on the line of the Chesapeake and Chesapeake Canal in August last and sentenced to the Penitentiary.

Approval of a bond and approved of John Wolf's bond as Quaker at William's prob and of the bond of Henry J. Williams as one of the assistant Police Inspectors in the City of Baltimore

Remission of a recognizance Henry Fritch of Washington County petitioned for the remission of a recognizance by which he had become bound to the State in the sum of \$500 for the appearance of his son.

The petition stated that his son had absconded without his knowledge or consent that he was an old and poor man and not worth one fifty dollars more than he sum he would have to pay if the forfeiture were exacted. His case having been recommended by Judge John Buchanan the said recognizance was remitted on condition of the payment of costs.
