The Governor pardoned Joseph Norman.

23rd

Nolle Prosequi

The Governor granted Nolle Prosequi, to Thomas Sappington, indicted for Forgery.

October 26th

Resignation

Cornelius McLean, Esq^r Secretary of State, resigned his office.

James Munay, Esq^r of Annapolis, appointed Secretary of State, vice, McLean, & qualified by taking the usual oaths.

John Ash of Baltimore County, appointed Justice of the peace by the Governor, in place of William Barnett, declined to serve.

Remission

of Charles E. Rheinhardt, petitioning the Governor for the remission of a Recognizance forfeited to Baltimore City Court for the appearance of Henry Smidt, or Schmidt.

The Court, (Justices Price, & Northington,) recommended the remission because of his being a good Citizen, an industrious mechanic, and as having his own family as well as Schmidts, his brother in law to support, and because of his being a foreigner, new to our institutions, and but slightly acquainted with the nature of the obligations he incurred.

He was also recommended by many respectable Citizens of Balt.

The Governor pardoned Daniel Brunner, sentenced by Allegany County Court at October Term 1840, to two years & 8 months confinement in the Penitentiary.

Peter Quigley

The Governor pardoned Peter Quigley sentenced by Allegany County Court to four years and eight months confinement in the Penitentiary at October Term 1840.

Remission

of

Recognizance

Richard Stallings applied to the Governor by petition for the remission of a Recognizance in thirty dollars for the appearance of Charles Graham, before Calvert County Court at May Term 1837.

The petition states, that after he entered into the Recognizance for the appearance of Charles Graham, he was committed to the Jail of Calvert County, for another offence, from which he escaped, & that he has not since been heard from, and that he is poor & unable to pay.

The remission is recommended by Judge Brewar, and many respectable Citizens of Calvert County, and was granted.
