

The Governor made a demand on the Governor of the State of Ohio for William H. Need, a fugitive from justice, in the following terms. State of Maryland To wit.

William Grason, Governor of the State of Maryland,  
To His Excellency The Governor of Ohio.

It appears by the annexed papers duly authenticated, according to the laws of this State, that William H. Need, a director in the Commercial Bank of Millington chartered by this State, stands charged by the oath of Osborn M. Macdaniel with having fraudulently embezzled, secreted and made away with money, goods, notes, evidences of debt, and other valuable securities belonging to said Bank, and it has been represented to me, that he has fled from the justice of this State, and has taken refuge within the State of Ohio.

Now therefore pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution and laws of the United States in such case made and provided, I do hereby request that the said William
