Pardons

The Governor granted a pardon to Timothy Mannion, and John O'Donnell, the first sentenced by Allegany County Court at October Term 1839, to nine years and eight months confinement in the Penitentiary for an assault with intent to kill; and the latter at same Term by the same Court for the same offence to fifteen years and eight months confinement in the Penitentiary.

15<sup>th</sup>

Pardon

The Governor granted a pardon to Philip Mayberry sentenced by Baltimore City Court at October Term 1840 to imprisonment for six months, for assaulting John Luigefalter, with intent to kill.

16<sup>th</sup>

Remission

of a fine. The Governor remitted a fine of Twenty five dollars, imposed by Justice Jacob Wickert of Hancock County March 11<sup>th</sup> 1840 on William Thosmaker, for profane swearing.

Approval of Bond

The Governor approved the bond of J. H. Harris, Treasurer of the Eastern Shore, dated 18<sup>th</sup> January 1841, and sent it to Clerk of Talbot County Court, to be recorded.

Sent also at same time, the bond of the late Treasurer dated 28<sup>th</sup> March 1840, to be recorded;

Wrote at same time to the Clerk of Talbot County Court to send copies; and also a copy of the bond of P. Robinson Treasurer of the Eastern Shore, executed in August 1840, which had been sent him by the late Secretary of State for Record.

Message

The Governor sent a message to the Senate & House of Delegates, transmitting Resolutions of the Legislature of Alabama, relating to the Tariff; also a message dated January 19<sup>th</sup> 1841, transmitting a communication from the New York Historical Society.

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
