of Bonds The Governor also approved the bond of Peter Storm, Inspector of hay and straw for the Eastern scales in the City of Baltimore, and of John Wetner Junr, as Inspector of flour for the City of Baltimore for the year 1841.

The Governor granted a Nolle Prosequi, to George Stubblefield of Allegany County, charged by the presentment of the grand jury of said County at April Term 1840, with keeping a gambling house within six months prior to said Term.

approval The Governor approved the bond of John Burke as weigher of straw for 1841.

Message The Governor withdrew the nomination of John M. Thompson as one of the Justices of the Orphans Court for Saint Mary's County, he having removed from the County, and nominating James Hebb in his place.
