

February 9th 1841

The Governor by message to the Senate withdrew the nominations for Civil appointments in Prince George's County made on the 28th ult., and made new nominations in place of them.

The Governor also by message returned to the Senate the list of nominations for Queen Anne's County, withdrawn for correction.

The Governor received a communication from the Chief Clerk of the Senate, informing him of the action of the Senate on the nominations submitted by him on the 28th ult. for civil appointments in Carroll County; also on those submitted on the 26th ult. for Talbot County, and on those submitted on the 22nd ult. for Allegany County.

20th

The Governor received a communication from the Chief Clerk of the Senate informing him of the proceedings of the Senate upon the nominations submitted by him for Carroll County on the 28th January, & 9th February ult.

Message

The Governor sent to the Senate his nominations for civil appointments for Charles County; he also nominated three justices of the peace for Washington County, and corrected the spelling of the name of Daniel Hoamer, who has been nominated as Justice of the 4th Elect District Court of that County to Daniel Hoamer.

The Governor approved the bond of David Pickett as Inspector of flour for the City of Baltimore for 1841.

The Governor communicated by message to both branches of the Legislature the Resolutions of the Legislature of Delaware in relation to the public lands.

He also nominated by message to the Senate, Lawrence Fullen to be an Auctioneer for the City of Baltimore.

The Governor granted pardons to Thomas Houston, and George Grayson, and John Smith, all James Grayson, convicted on indictment in Baltimore County Court at April Term 1835, of horse stealing; on account of their penitence and good behaviour, and the recommendation of the Directors of the Penitentiary, The Rev. Doct^r Wm E. Myatt, and many respectable persons.

Pardon

The Governor also granted a pardon to Frederick Hephart, convicted in Baltimore County Court at November Term 1840 of Burglary; on the recommendation of the Directors of the Penitentiary & other persons.

The Governor approved the bond of Daniel Hooper as Gauger & Inspector for 1841.

Also remitted the fine of five dollars imposed by Anne Arundel County Court at October Term 1840. in Benjamin Robes, for an assault & battery on Liddston Baird.
