The name of Joshua Clark was withdrawn by me, on the 8th inst, and was therefore no longer before the Senate, which circumstance was no doubt overlooked when the nominations for Caroline County were under consideration.

I withdraw the nomination of Daniel Collins, Joseph R. Coombs, William E. Murphy, and Thomas S. Reid as Justices of the peace for Montgomery County, and nominate as Justices of the peace for that County, William H. Hays and Thomas Hall.

I also withdraw the nomination of William Henshead as Coroner and Justice of the peace, and of John W. Conroy and Stephen Bayard as Justices of the peace for Cecil County.

I nominate Joseph J. Richardson and John M. Williams as Justices of the peace for Calvert County; Edward Thompson as Justice of the peace for Harford County; Alfred P. Woodruff and Abraham Sheaffer as Justices of the peace for Baltimore County, and Richard M. Hall as Auctioneer in the City of Baltimore.
