The Governor nominated William Ridesel to be Third Lieutenant of the "Fury"
"Town Guards", 47th Reg^t M. M.

The Governor also nominated Thomas Stanton, Thomas, F. Bowk, Elisha
Malourey, and Nathaniel Todd Sout, as Justices of the Peace for Caroline County
in addition to the number confirmed by the Senate.

The Governor approved the bond of John S. Gettys as Comptroller of Loans
for 1841, and deposited it with the Treasurer.

The Governor received the proceedings of the Comptroller of Loans of
Charles County, making nomination of Tobacco Inspectors for that County
sent marked 20th October

A few days after he received a report of proceedings of the same
Comptroller, on the same subject, differing essentially from the first, sent
