The Governor nominated William Reederel to be their Lieutenant of the "Ferry Town Guards; 47<sup>th</sup> Regt. M. A.

The Governor also nominated Thomas Stanton, Thomas F. Bourke, Elihu Maloney, and Nathan Todd Scott as Justices of the Peace for Baltimore County in addition to the number confirmed by the Senate.

The Governor received a communication from the Chief Clerk of the Senate informing him of the proceedings of the Senate, on the nomination of Daniel Flone to be a justice of the peace for Baltimore City, made on the 16<sup>th</sup> inst., on the nomination for Civil appointments in Charles County, made on the 10<sup>th</sup> inst., on the nomination for Civil appointments for Harford County made on the 28<sup>th</sup> ulto, or the nominations for civil appointments for Frederick County made on the 22<sup>d</sup> ulto, on the nomination of George Washington Hale as Coroner for Harford County; on the nomination of Lloyd D. O'Brien to be a Justice of the peace for Harford County, on the nomination of Tobacco Inspectors for Prince George's County made on the 22<sup>d</sup> ulto, on the nomination of Civil appointments for Montgomery County made on the 22<sup>d</sup> ulto, and on the nomination of Inspectors of Tobacco at the State War House, in the City of Baltimore, made on the 22<sup>d</sup> ulto.

approval of Bond  
The Governor approved the bond of John S. Gittings as Commissioner of Taxes for 1841, and deposited it with the Treasurer.

The Governor received the proceedings of the Commissioners of Charles County, making nominations of Tobacco Inspectors for that County post marked 20<sup>th</sup> October.

A few days after he received a report of proceedings of the same Commissioners, on the same subject, differing essentially from the first, post marked 34<sup>th</sup> February.

The Governor received a communication from the Chief Clerk of the Senate, informing him of the proceedings of the Senate on the nominations for civil appointments for Dorchester County, made on the 5<sup>th</sup> inst., on the nomination for civil appointments for Howard District of Anne Arundel County made on the 26<sup>th</sup> ulto, and on the nomination for civil appointments for Queen Anne's County, made on the 22<sup>d</sup> ulto.
