The Governor nominates Tobacco Inspectors for Benedict & Pomonkey Ware houses in Charles County, and for Nottingham Ware house in Prince Georges County: He also nominates an Inspector of Lumber for the City of Baltimore, in place of a former nominee, rejected.

He also nominates a Justice of the peace for Caroline County, and a Justice of the 4th Election district of Prince George, in place of a nominee rejected.

In pursuance of an act passed the present Session, entitled "an act to limit the number of Justices of the peace for Cecil County," I nominate for Justices of the peace for that County

The Governor also nominates a Justice of District N^o 2 for Montgomery County, in place of a nominee rejected, a Justice of District Court N^o 4 of said County, in place of a nominee rejected. He also nominates two Justices of the peace for Baltimore County, a Justice of the peace for Allegany County, and two Justices of the peace for Baltimore City in place of two nominees rejected by the Senate.

The Governor pardons Charles Norris convicted of felony by Baltimore District City Court at February Term 1841, on the recommendation of the Court. He also pardons Mary and Gilbert, all Alley and Toomey, convicted of felony at February Term 1841, on the recommendation of the same Court
