The Governor sent the following communication to the Senate.

To the Senate.

March 9<sup>th</sup> 1841

Nominate Wm. M. Townsend and Samuel B. Sears as  
Justices of the Orphans Court for Cecil County, in place of William  
Mackay, and William Torbert Junt. rejected.

John W. McCullough and Benjamin W. Davis as  
Inspectors Measurers and Markers of Lumber at Port Deposit in  
Cecil County, in place of Allison Brandle, and Francis Boyd  
rejected; and Hugh S. Boyd, as Inspector of Shingles at Port Deposit  
Cecil County in place of Francis Gordon rejected.

It appears from the communication received yes-  
terday from the Senate, that Henry Klinefelter was rejected as Ins-  
pector of Lumber at Hackensack Town in Cecil County. Mr. Klinefelter  
was nominated for that office on the 22<sup>nd</sup> of January, and was with-  
drawn on the 25<sup>th</sup> of the same month, at which time Washington  
Price was nominated in his place. The nomination of the latter  
is therefore still before the Senate.

The Governor issues his Proclamation concerning the Legislature  
in the following words.

### Proclamation

Whereas the Senate and House of Delegates have declared by their  
joint resolution of the 5<sup>th</sup> inst, that the time to which their session was  
then limited, was not sufficient to enable them to transact the impor-  
tant business entrusted to their charge, and have requested me to  
convene them, at the earliest convenient day, after the 15<sup>th</sup> of April next.

And whereas the Senate and House of Delegates, have the  
best means of forming a correct judgment in relation to the impor-  
tance of the business under their consideration, and to the necessity of  
having further time to act upon it.

And, whereas it is desirable that questions of so much  
interest to the State, as to require a special call of the Legislature  
should be settled without unnecessary delay.

I do therefore convene the General Assembly of Maryland in compliance  
with the request contained in the resolution aforesaid, and do accordingly give  
notice to the members thereof to assemble at the seat of Government, on Wednesday  
the 24<sup>th</sup> day of the present month, for the purpose of transacting such  
business
