**Remission of a Fine** The Governor remitted the fine imposed by Baltimore City Court upon Hannah Smithson at February Term 1840, except one hundred dollars & costs, upon the recommendation of two of the Judges of Baltimore City Court, and many respectable persons.

**Repair of Tobacco House at Nottingham** The Governor authorized Henry M. Chew Inspector of Tobacco at Nottingham Prince Georges County to employ Michael P. Barrille to act as Commissioner, and to contract for repairing the Tobacco House at Nottingham, under the act of 1835, chap. 64.

**Demand of a fugitive** The Governor made a demand on the Governor of New York, for George F. Weed, late President of the Commercial Bank of Millington in Kent County a fugitive from justice, charged on the oath of Osborn M. M<sup>c</sup> Daniel with having, <sup>fraudulently</sup> embezzled, secreted and made away with, money, goods, notes and evidences of debt, and other valuable securities and effects to a large amount unknown; the property of the Commercial Bank of Millington: and appointed Osborn M. M<sup>c</sup> Daniel, to receive and convey him to the State of Maryland.
