The Governor appointed David Burbank auctioneer in the City of Baltimore.

May 18th 1841

The Governor issued duplicate certificate of the remission of the forfeited recognizance of Charles E. Rhinhardt of Baltimore City.

The Governor appointed Daniel Blocher Register of Wills for Alleghany County in the place of Heck deceased.

May 19th 1841

The Governor appointed George Webster Captain of the 3^d Company 17th Reg^t of Maryland Militia

The Governor appointed Joseph N. Birch 1st Lieutenant of the 5^d Company 17th Reg^t Maryland Militia in the place of George Webster promoted.

The Governor appointed William M. K. Kessler Justice of the Peace Washington County

The Governor appointed Jacob W. Legg Justice of the Peace, Queen Anns County in the place of John E. Gibson resigned.

21st May 1841

The Governor appointed George Cook Lottery Commissioner in the place of Samuel S. Dickinson deceased.

The Governor selected Sarah Lynch a blind girl of Washington County as a pupil of the Pennsylvania Institution for the instruction of the blind.

The Governor having carefully ascertained the number of votes given for each person voted for as members of Congress to represent this State in the next Congress of the United States, & having found that Isaac D. Jones of the first District, James A. Pearce of the second District, James W. Williams of the third District, Alexander Randall and John P. Kennedy of the fourth District, William Cost Johnson of the fifth District, John Thompson Mason of the sixth District and Augustus R. Sellers of the seventh District had the highest number of votes in their respective Districts and were duly elected members to represent this State in the next Congress of the United States, issued according to law the following

Proclamation.

Whereas I have received from the Judges of Election in the several Counties of this State, returns of an Election held on Monday the seventeenth instant for members to represent this State in the Congress of the United States and have carefully examined the votes given for every person voted for as such:
