

May 31st 1841

The Governor appointed James P. Carleton a Justice of the Peace for Alleghany County in the place of Daniel Hooker made Register of Wills; also John T. Taylor Justice of the Peace same County in place of William Hottelzell who refuses to serve.

June 1st 1841

The Governor reduced the fine imposed at April Term 1841 of Alleghany County Court on Jonathan Hendrickson, from Fifty dollars to Ten, on the petition of many members of the Bar and other respectable persons.

The Governor appointed Samuel Severson a Justice of the Peace in Cecil County in place of Jacob Price who declines serving.

The Governor granted a Nolle Prosequi to Thomas Sappington presented and indicted in Baltimore City Court on two cases of Forgery, on the recommendation of the Judges of Court and other respectable persons.

June 2nd 1841

The Governor appointed Samuel Roberts Justice of the Orphans Court in Queen Annes County in place of Thomas Wright 9th appointed Secretary of State.

The Governor appointed James H. Millikin Captain of the "City Guards" a company in the 53rd Regiment Maryland Militia in place of Grafton D. Spurrier resigned.

May 25th 1841 (Omitted)

The Governor approved of the Agreement made by James Cole State Wharfinger to James P. Pindell of a part of the State's wharf in Baltimore City.

June 3rd 1841

The Governor sent a copy of the Resolutions of the Legislature of Maryland in relation to the Tobacco Trade to each of the Senators and Representatives in Congress.

June 4th 1841

The Governor remitted the fine imposed by Washington County Court at March Term 1841 on the following persons, for assault, viz Parker Punnington, John Chaney (in two cases), Ephraim Wolf, Lewis Chaney and John Seiger.

May 25th Omitted

Governor granted further respite to Frederick Fritz until further orders. See Record Book, Fritz, 36.

June 8th 1841

The Governor having examined the paper miting sent from the office of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal Company declaring the assent of the Stockholders to the Act of Assembly in their favour received on the 27th May, this day returned information of its receipt.

June 9th 1841

The Governor remitted the fine, and sentence of imprisonment (for the balance of the term) passed on Daniel Mains in two cases for assaulting & beating Aaron Durrall and Daniel P. Myers on the recommendation of the Judges of Baltimore City Court.

June 11th 1841

Governor remitted the fine imposed on William Seiger, he having already been in prison 20 days more than he was sentenced, and because he is very poor and of course unable to pay the fine.
