Congress a printed copy of an Act of Assembly entitled an Act for the completion of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal to Cumberland.

June 14th 1841

Governor remitted the forfeited recognizance of James C. Coulahan and Patrick
Cognizance re: Hopkins on the recommendation of Judge Shivers.

July 1st 1841

Pardon
Governor granted a pardon to William Miller convicted of felony in Baltimore
City Court on the recommendation of the Judges and other respectable persons.

Pardon
Governor granted a pardon to Eliza Christophers convicted of Larceny
in Baltimore City Court on the recommendation of the Judges and other respect-
able persons.

July 19th 1841

Proclamation
At the solicitation of the Presidents and Directors of the "Frederick County Bank"
Frederick and many other respectable persons the Governor issued the following as
County
A Proclamation.

Banks
By the Governor of Maryland.

Whereas it has been stated to me by the Presidents and Directors of
the "Frederick County Bank" that on the night of the twenty second of May last
the banking house of the said Bank was burglariously entered by some person or
persons unknown, and robbed of a large amount of funds consisting of Gold Coin,
State bonds, Private checks, Canal scrip, and Bank notes of various descriptions and
denominations: And whereas a considerable portion of the said funds has been returned to

the said bank under circumstances which leave no doubt that a number of persons were asso-
ciated together in the commission of the said robbery and in the division of the plunder:

And whereas it is important to the ends of Justice that the perpetrators of so great a crime
