

July 24<sup>th</sup> 1841

Remission of  
for<sup>th</sup> Recognition of Judge Maynard and Purviance, judges of Harford County when it had been failed  
to give out certificates to Harford County Court, also to Cecil County, when he had been arrested on a case.

Governor acknowledged receipt of the proceedings of the following Banks.

Banks "Union Bank of Baltimore" "Farmers and Merchants Bank"  
"Bank of Baltimore"

Carbury "Marine Bank of Baltimore", and addressed a letter to the Governor Joseph C. L. Revd. Dr. Levy in pursuance of the directions contained in Resolution No 3 of December Session 1840

July 29<sup>th</sup> 1841

Governor received, filed and acknowledged the receipt of proceedings of the Stockholders, and  
Bank of the President and Directors of the Commercial and Farmers Banks of Baltimore.

July 30<sup>th</sup> 1841

Pardon Governor granted a pardon to Alfred Durbeck a convict in the Penitentiary upon the  
recommendation of the Swedish Minister upon condition of said Alfred Durbeck leaving the United  
States and not returning.

Pardon Governor granted a Pardon to John Liger upon the recommendation of many members of the  
Bar on the grounds of his being almost a child.

Pardon Governor granted a Pardon to George M. Bowen a convict in the Penitentiary upon the recom-  
mendation of the Directors of that Institution and many other respectable persons.

Pardon Governor granted a Pardon to John Davis upon the recommendation of the Jury who tried  
and found him guilty.

August 9<sup>th</sup> 1841

The following communication was received.

Extract from the Minutes of the Board Augt. 4<sup>th</sup> 1841

Resolved that the Governor be requested to consent to a reduction of  
the fare for the transportation of passengers on the Washington Branch  
of the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road Company who may be going to or returning  
from any camp meeting for religious worship to a rate which shall not be  
less in proportion than one dollar and forty five cents for the entire distance  
between the two cities. I hereby certify the foregoing to be a true copy
