William G. Mason, Governor of the State of Maryland, To all to whom these presents may come: Know that his Excellency the Governor of Pennsylvania - It appears by the annexed papers duly authenticated according to the laws of this State that George Corduroy stands indicted for felony, and it has been represented to me that he has fled from the justice of this State, and has taken refuge within the State of Pennsylvania -

Now therefore, Pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution and Laws of the United States in such case made and provided, I do hereby request that the said George Corduroy be apprehended and delivered to John Zell who is hereby duly authorized to receive and convey him to the State of Maryland there to be dealt with according to law.

Demand of a fugitive

State of Maryland to wit.

William G. Mason Governor of the State of Maryland, To his Excellency the Governor of South Carolina - It appears, by the annexed papers duly authenticated according to the laws of this State that Charles Greenwood and James H. Dunn stand charged by affidavits of felony and it has been represented to me that they have fled from the justice of this State and have taken refuge within the State of South Carolina.

Now therefore, Pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution and Laws of the United States in such case made and provided, I do hereby request that the said Charles Greenwood and James H. Dunn be apprehended and delivered to ^{Henry W. Matthews} George W. Briggs, who is hereby duly authorized to receive and convey them to the State of Maryland there to be dealt with according to law.
