The Governor made a demand upon the Governor of New York for Munro Edwards, a fugitive from justice as follows:

State of Maryland: To wit:

Demand of

a fugitive

William Grayson, Governor of the State of Maryland, to his Excellency the Governor of State of New York.

It appears by the annexed papers duly authenticated according to the laws of this State that Munro Edwards stands charged by indictment with felony, and it has been represented to me that he has fled from the justice of this State and has taken refuge within the State of New York.

Now therefore, Pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution and Laws of the United States in such case made and provided, I do hereby request that the said Munro Edwards be apprehended and delivered to John Stutchell or Archibald G. Ridgeley, or either of them, both or either of whom are hereby duly authorized to receive and convey him to the State of Maryland there to be dealt with according to law.

Demand

of a fugitive

Governor made a demand upon the Chief Judge of the District of Columbia as follows

State of Maryland To wit:

William Grayson Governor of the State of Maryland, to William Branch Chief Judge of the Circuit Court of the United States, for the District of Columbia. It appears by the annexed papers duly authenticated according to the Laws of this State, that negro Williams slave of Messrs T. Lamar stands indicted for felony, and it has been represented to me that he has fled from the justice of this State and taken refuge within the District of Columbia. Now therefore pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution and laws of the United States in such case made & provided I do hereby request that the said negro Williams slave as aforesaid be apprehended and delivered Thomas H. Edlin Sheriff of Prince Georges County who is hereby duly authorized to receive and convey him to the State of Maryland there to be dealt with according to law.
