Remission of a Fine. Governor remitted the fine of twenty dollars imposed on Thomas de Greary by Civil County Court at Oct. Term 1841, on account of the recommendation of the Grand Jury, and the general circumstances of the case, and especially because it was represented that he was unable to pay it.

Note Provs. William Bond who had been indicted by Saint Mary's County Court for felony, petitioned the Governor for a writ of habeas corpus, which upon examination of the whole matter, was granted as follows:

State of Maryland Courts:

Whereas a certain William Bond late of Saint Mary's County stands charged by indictment of the Grand Jury of the said County with felony: And whereas the said William Bond has been recommended to Executive clemency on the ground that he was innocent of the said charge which appears from the deposition of Mrs. Hays the owner of the house and of other persons who were present when the house was entered:

Now therefore I, William G. Mason, Governor of the State of Maryland do hereby grant a writ of habeas corpus to the said William Bond on account of the aforesaid offences upon the payment of the costs accrued upon the said indictment and proceedings and other proceedings if any, and order and direct that all further proceedings against him on the indictment aforesaid do cease and determine upon the payment of the costs aforesaid, and that no further prosecution be had or carried on against him for or on account of said offences.
