Governor granted a Pardon to Edmund or Ned Kelly a convict in the Penitentiary on the recommendation of the Directors of that institution.

27th

Governor made a demand upon the Chief Justice of the District of Columbia in the following words

State of Maryland To wit:

William Grayson Governor of the State of Maryland

To the Hon^{ble}. William Branch Chief Judge of the Circuit Court of the United States for the District of Columbia. It appears by the annexed papers, duly authenticated according to the Laws of this State that William Kite stands charged by affidavit with felony, and it has been represented to me that he has fled from the jurisdiction of this State and has taken refuge in the District of Columbia.

Demand of a fugitive

Now therefore pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution and laws of the United States in such case made and provided I do hereby request that the said William Kite be apprehended and delivered to Archibald G. Ridgely who is hereby appointed to and duly authorized to receive and convey him to the State of Maryland there to be dealt with according to Law.

In witness whereof I have hereunto affixed my name and the Great Seal of the State this twenty third day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty one.

Governor remitted the fine of twenty dollars imposed by Kent County Court at September Term 1841 on William R. Apsley for keeping a disorderly house and selling on the Sabbath, on the recommendation of the Judges of the Court.

Governor granted a Pardon to John Alinchers, who was sentenced to confinement in Baltimore County Jail for three months and to pay a fine of twenty dollars for sitting a dog on Corbin Drivers, on the petition of many respectable persons, and because he has already suffered by unfair means for eight weeks.
