

January 24th

The Governor nominated to the Senate Henry M. Pettitt as Surveyor of Allegany County vice Benjamin Brown.

January 25th

The Governor nominated to the Senate John C. Legrand as Secretary of State vice John Sifford, who declined accepting the appointment.

The Governor nominated to the Senate John H. S. Magruder as State Librarian vice David Ridgely.

January 31st

The Governor received a Message from the Senate suggesting the doubt whether consistently with the Constitution he had the power to nominate John C. Legrand to be Secretary of State at the time he was nominated because of his being a member of the House of Delegates asking him to withdraw that nomination, and renew it.

The Governor nominated anew John C. Legrand as Secretary of State vice John Sifford, who declines the appointment, confined the same day.

February 1st

John C. Legrand qualified as Secretary of State by taking and subscribing the usual oaths.

The Governor nominated to the Senate Henry Hobbs as Examiner general for the Western shore.

February 2nd 1842.

The Governor sent down to the Senate to day, the civil list for Allegany County, consisting of Justices of the Orphans Court, Notaries public, Coroners and Justices of the peace.

February 3rd 1842

The Governor sent down to the Senate to day, the civil list for Calvert County, including the Justices of the Orphans Court, Surveyor, Coroners, and Justices of the peace; and also the civil list for Montgomery County, including Justices of the Orphans Court, Commissioners of Tax, County, Surveyor and Justices of the peace.

February 5th 1842.

The Governor sent down to the Senate to day, the civil list for Anne Arundel County, including Justices of the Orphans Court, Notary Public, Surveyor, and Justices of the peace, and also the nominations for Howard district.

Feb 8th 1842.

The Governor sent down to day the civil list for Carroll Co.

Feb 9th 1842.

The Governor sent down to the Senate to day the nomination of George McCallough as Clerk of Cecil County.

A military commission which issued on the 30th day of July 1841 to John C. Gray by mistake, was this day altered to James C. Gray. The Commission was that of 2nd Lieut of Company No 2, 43rd Regiment of M^o Ma.

A message was this day received from the Senate informing the
