12th

This day forwarded to Thomas St. M. Wilson, the Commission of sheriff for Montgomery County in the place of Henry Lilly deceased.

This day made a requisition on the Governor of Virginia for James Johnson charged with stealing a stone maw, the property of a Mr. Sheppard of Baltimore

14th

This day sent down to the senate the civil lists for Queen Ann, St. Mary's, Baltimore and Prince George counties.

15th

This day received a message from the senate advising and consenting to nomination of George McCullough as clerk of Cecil County Court, which was made on the 9th instant; also advising to the nominations for Calvert, made on the 3rd instant, the nominations for Baltimore County, made the 14th instant; the nominations for Anne Arundel County and Howard district made on the 14th inst, and also the nominations made on the 14th instant for Prince George County, except Richard Sealle to be surveyor to which they refused to assent.

This day commissioned George McCullough his commission as Clerk of Cecil County Court.

16th

Forwarded to the Clerk and Register of Mills for Prince George County, commissions for all the civil list for said County except surveyor, to the Register of Mills and clerk of Calvert County, the commissions for said County, and to the proper officers in Anne Arundel County and Howard district.

17th

sent to the senate the civil list for Baltimore City, Kent, Washington and Charles Counties; and also certain Military nominations.

18th

Gave permission to Michael A. Gorman (who was released from the Penitentiary on condition he would leave the state), to return to the city of Baltimore for ninety days. Said permission was in these words.

"Whereas it has been represented to me by Michael A. Gorman that he was released from the Penitentiary of Maryland, on condition of his leaving the state for seven years, the time of his sentence: And whereas the said Gorman wishes to return to the city of Baltimore for a short time for the purpose of selling, or otherwise disposing of, a house in the said city heretofore mortgaged by his mother; I do therefore give permission to the said Michael A. Gorman to return to the state of Maryland for that purpose and to remain within the limits of the same for a period not exceeding ninety days, during which time he shall be free from arrest or molestation on account of the offence for which he was originally imprisoned in the
