

That if he committed any error that it was an error of judgment only

19th Sept 1842

Committed the fines growing out of the forfeited recognizances entered into by George Bence in St. Mary's County Court at March term 1834 and August term 1835 that a certain Charles Black would keep the peace.

19th Sept 1842

This day committed the fine imposed upon Anthony Dollen and Peter D. Dollen by James Tuckale a justice of the peace of Anne Arundel County for selling as Masters and Pedlars, it being shown to the Court that they were licensed.

19th Sept 1842

This day pronounced William Howell who was convicted in Carroll County Court at September term 1842 of stealing a watch, the said Howell being recommended to Executive Mercy by the jurors who tried his case.

19th Sept 1842

This day committed the fine of ten dollars each which was imposed upon Patrick Brady, John Knight, Richard Russell, James Dorsey and James Larkin by Washington County Court at December 1842, so far as Patrick (or Curley) their security is concerned.

19th Sept 1842

This day made a requisition upon the Governor of Pennsylvania in these words:

State of Maryland, To W.P.

I Francis Thomas, Governor of Maryland,

To His Excellency the Governor of Pennsylvania.

It appears by the annexed papers, duly authenticated according to the laws of this state, that a certain negro named Thomas Coates, is charged upon the oath of John B. Hammond with felony and it has been represented to me that he has fled from the justice of this state, and has taken refuge within the State of Pennsylvania.

And therefore, Pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution and laws of the United States in such case made and provided, I do hereby request that the said Thomas Coates be apprehended and delivered to George Hughes of Lancaster, who is hereby authorized to receive and convey him to the State of Maryland, that he be dealt with according to law.

In Witness Whereof I have hereunto affixed my name and the Great Seal of the State, the nineteenth day of September in the year of Our Lord One Thousand Eight hundred and forty two.
