

September 28th 1842

This day remitted the fine of twenty dollars which was imposed upon James B. Bookes of Queen Ann County, by the Judges of the 3rd Election District Court of Queen Ann County for an assault and battery, said remission being recommended by the judges who imposed the fine.

Sept 29th 1842.

This day appointed William Jackson Clerk of Dorchester County Court vice Edmund P. LeCompt deceased.

25th Sept 1842.

This day made a requisition upon the Chief Judge of the Circuit Court of the United States for the District of Columbia; said requisition being in these words:

"State of Maryland, - To Wit:

J. Francis Thomas Governor of the State of Maryland,

To

Chief Judge of the Circuit Court of the United States for the District of Columbia.

It appears by the annexed papers, duly authenticated according to the laws of this state, that a certain Thomas Gallagher alias Joshua Young is charged upon the oath of Charles G. Moxley with having stolen a grey horse the property of the heirs of Joshua Moxley deceased, which said theft is a crime according to the laws of Maryland and punishable as such; and it has been represented to me that he has fled from the justice of this state, and has taken refuge within the District of Columbia.

Now therefore, Pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution and laws of the United States in such case made and provided, I do hereby request the said Thomas Gallagher alias Joshua Young to be apprehended and delivered to Simon Hays who is hereby duly authorized to receive and convey him to the State of Maryland, there to be dealt with according to law.

In Witness Whereof, I have hereunto affixed my name and the Great Seal of the State this twenty-fifth day of September in the year of Our Lord One Thousand eight hundred and forty two.
