This day pardoned Alexander Bryden, (so far as imprisonment is concerned) for an assault upon a freeman in the discharge of his duty, the same being recommended by the judges and Grand Jury of Baltimore City Court and many other respectable Citizens.

Nov 15th 1842.

This day drew a requisition upon his Excellency the Governor of Virginia for the apprehension and delivery of a certain Isaac Goudkoup; said requisition being in these words:

State of Maryland; - to wit:

J. Francis Thomas, Governor of the State of Maryland

To His Excellency the Governor of Virginia.

It appears by the annexed Papers, duly authenticated according to the laws of this State, that a certain Isaac Goudkoup is charged on oath by George J. Maye, and others of having obtained by false pretences, certain goods to a large amount from George J. Maye & Co, E. Miller & Co, and Franklin Gardner, which said act is a crime by the laws of Maryland; and it has been represented to me that he has fled from the justice of this State, and has taken refuge within the State of Virginia.

Now Therefore, Pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution and laws of the United States in such cases made and provided, I do hereby request that the said Isaac Goudkoup to be apprehended and delivered to George Riggs who is hereby duly authorized to receive and convey him to the State of Maryland, there to be dealt with according to law.

In Witness Whereof, I have hereunto affixed my name and the Great Seal of the State, this fifteenth day of November in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and forty two.

This day remitted the fines which were imposed upon William Reier, Henry Reier and George Crofts of ten dollars each, for selling as Whiskey and Rellor, by James Maston, a justice of the peace for Howard district; the same having been recommended, because of the extreme poverty of the parties, and their ignorance of the laws of the State, being strangers.
