

December 31st 1842.

This day remitted fines imposed upon William Mace, committed in Anne Arundel County, of dealing with negroes, he having undergone a long imprisonment in the County jail, and ~~been~~ recommended by a large body of the citizens of Anne Arundel Co.

January 3rd 1843.

This day the Governor sent the following message to the House of Delegates:

Annapolis, January 3rd 1843.

To the Honorable

The General Assembly:

I have the honor here with to submit, the annual report of the Directors of the Annapolis & Edgemoor Rail Road Company; of the President and Directors of the Baltimore Gas & Light Rail Road Company; of the President and Directors of the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal Company; of Thomas Thistle late Superintendent of the National Road; of J. S. Hedgeson, the present Superintendent of the National Road within the limits of Maryland; of the President and Directors of the Maryland Penitentiary, and a report of the Committee on ~~the~~ Manufactures to the Directors of the Maryland Penitentiary.

This day the Governor nominated to the Senate Richard Henry Marshall of Frederick County as an associate Judge of the 5th Judicial District, vice Abraham Shriver resigned; and on the same day the Senate advised and consented to the nomination.

January 8th 1843.

The Governor sent the following message to the House of Delegates:

Annapolis, January 8th 1843.

To the Honorable, The General Assembly:

I have with here the honor to submit, a statement received from James M. McCulloch, Comptroller of the Treasury of the United States, showing the amount of the distributive share of the State of Maryland of the proceeds of the sales of the public lands; and also, letters received from the Clerks of the Commissioners of the several counties respecting the income and ground rent tax laws.

The Governor this day remitted the fine of five hundred dollars which was imposed upon Johnston Glee of Baltimore, by Baltimore City Court at June term 1842 for acting as Exchange Broker without a license. It being represented to the Governor, that the case was decided by consent between the parties fined and the deputy attorney General to test the constitutionality of the act of 1841.
