On the recommendation of a number of respectable citizens of Baltimore, the Governor this day remitted the fine of fifteen dollars which was imposed upon William Brown for an assault and battery, by Baltimore City Court, at its November term 1842.

January 30<sup>th</sup> 1843.

The Governor this day sent to the House of Delegates, the following message:

To the Honorable

The General Assembly:

Agreeably to their request, I have the honor to submit for your consideration, the communication of the Presidents of the Petersburg and Richmond Rail Road Companies, proposing a reduction of the fare of passengers on the Washington Branch of the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road.
