

Now therefore, Francis Thomas, Governor of the State of Maryland, do hereby grant a *Wolles Prosequi* to the said John W. Simmons on account of the aforesaid offence, upon the payment of the costs accrued upon such proceedings against him, and order and direct that all further proceedings against him, on account of the offence aforesaid, do cease and determine, upon payment of the costs aforesaid, and that no further proceedings be had or carried on against him for or on account of said offence.
