The Governor to day granted the following requisition upon the Governor of Pennsylvania.

"State of Maryland, - To His

J. Francis Thomas, Governor of the State of Maryland.

To His Excellency, The Governor of Pennsylvania.

Requisition.

It appears by the annexed papers, duly authenticated according to the laws of this state, that on the oaths of Nathaniel M. Waters and Edward Waters of Montgomery County, State of Maryland, that Negroes William, aged about 33 years, about 5 feet, 10 inches high, John aged about 29, about 5 feet 9 or 10 inches high, Daniel aged about 19 years, about 5 feet 8 or 9 inches high and George aged about 30 years, about 6 foot and something upwards high, have against their said owners and masters, (the said Nathaniel and the said Edward Waters,) will and consent, with a view to escape from servitude, to which they are all bound as slaves for life, escaped to the State of Pennsylvania, which said escape of said negroes is felony by the act of assembly of this State of the year 1838, chapter 63; and it has been represented to me that they fled from the justice of this state, and have taken refuge within the state of Pennsylvania.

Now therefore, Pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution and Laws of the United States in such case made and provided, I do hereby request that the said negroes, William, John, Daniel and George to be apprehended and delivered to George Stanger of Lancaster Pennsylvania who is hereby duly authorized to receive and convey them to the State of Maryland, there to be dealt with according to law.
