

March 29th 1843

This day pardoned Ferdinand Chamilla, Draft Williamson, Frank Whelan and
Catharine Flaherty, - see "Record of Pardons"

April 7th 1843

This day remitted the forfeited recognizances of James Bunnell, the same being recom-
mended by the judges of Prince George County Court, who state that the said James
Bunnell had entered into new recognizances.

April 7th 1843

This day commuted the sentence of two years and one month confinement in the
Penitentiary which was imposed upon William Scott, a boy, for stealing a gun, by
Charles County Court, to two months confinement in the jail of Charles County, the same
having been recommended by the judges and the jurors who tried his case.

April 10th 1843

This day issued the following requisition:

"State of Maryland, - To Wit:

J. Francis Thomas, Governor of the State of Maryland,

To the honorable, The Chief Judge of the Circuit Court of the United States for the District of Columbia

It appears by the annexed Papers, duly authenticated according to the laws of
this State, that John Keller stands charged on indictment in Prince George County, State
of Maryland with felony, and it has been represented to me that he has fled from
the justice of this State, and has taken refuge within the District of Columbia.

Now Therefore, Pursuant to the Provisions of the Constitution and
Laws of the United States in such case made and provided, I do hereby request that
the said John Keller to be apprehended and delivered to who
is hereby duly authorized to receive and convey him to the State of Maryland, there
to be dealt with according to law.

April 13th 1843

The Governor to day pardoned Alexander Kennedy, a boy, who was convicted in Baltimore County Court at
April term 1843 of stealing a pair of boots, he having been recommended to the mercy of the Executive

April 15th 1843

The Governor to day appointed John Reilly a Quaker of beds, and Inspector of domestic distilled
liquors in the City of Baltimore vice Luther Ratsliff deceased.

April 17th 1843

The Governor to day issued an order to the Sheriff of Baltimore County to apprehend and
deliver to John Deane the agent of the State of New York, a certain Henry Potter, alias Henry
