

Conwell, alias Michael Fitzsimmons a fugitive from justice of the state of New York, he being charged with burglary and an assault with intent to kill.

April 18th 1843

The Governor to day, on the recommendation of the judges of Prince George County Court, and that of the deputy Attorney General of said Court, remitted the forfeited recognizance which was entered into by James Webster for his appearance before said Court to testify, it appearing from recommendations that the said James Webster did attend said Court, and that he did answer to the call of his name, but said answer not being heard by the clerk, his recognizance was forfeited.

April 24th 1843

The Governor to day issued a requisition upon the Governor of Pennsylvania for the apprehension of Adam Horn charged with the murder of his wife Malinda Horn, the requisition being as follows.

State of Maryland, - To Wit:

J. Francis Thomas, Governor of the State of Maryland,

To His Excellency The Governor of Pennsylvania.

It appears by the annexed Papers, duly authenticated according to the laws of this State, that before Henry Snyder, a justice of the peace of this State, that a certain William Poist, did in due form of law make oath, that on or about the 22nd day of March last in Baltimore County, State of Maryland, that a certain Malinda Horn was cruelly and brutally murdered, that the head, legs and arms were dismembered from the body of the said Malinda and that there is strong cause to suspect that a certain Adam Horn, her husband, committed the murder aforesaid; that the legs and arms were found concealed in the house of the said Adam Horn, who so soon as he learned search was to be made for the body of the murdered Malinda Horn took flight; and it has been represented to me that he has fled from the justice of this State, and has taken refuge within the State of Pennsylvania.

Now Therefore, pursuant to the Constitution and laws of the United States in such case made and provided, I do hereby request that the said Adam Horn to be apprehended and delivered to Archibald Ridgely of Baltimore, who is hereby duly authorized to receive and convey him to the State of Maryland, there to be dealt with according to law.
