

Sept. 16th 1843

The Governor to day commissioned Daniel H. Candler as Sheriff of Montgomery County, he being second on the return vice Thomas F. W. Vinson deceased.

Sept 16th 1843

The Governor to day directed the Sheriff of Baltimore County to apprehend and surrender James Morton who is charged with the crime of forgery in the city of Philadelphia, the Governor of Pennsylvania having demanded him as a fugitive from justice.

September 20th 1843

The Governor to day on the recommendation of a large number of respectable citizens of Charles County remitted a fine of five hundred dollars which was imposed upon John S. Skinner by Charles County Court at March term 1843 for an assault with intent to commit a rape upon a Mrs. Wheeler.

Sept 22nd 1843.

The Governor to day, on the recommendation of the Directors of the Penitentiary pardoned John F. Brown, (see Record of Pardons.

Sept 23rd 1843.

The Governor to day pardoned Edgar P. Brown a convict in the Penitentiary on the recommendation of the Directors of that institution and then

The Governor directed suit to be brought against Carlton the collector of state taxes in Allegany County for balance due by him to state for taxes of 1841 and 1842.

Oct 2nd 1843.

The Governor to day directed the Deputy Attorney General for Anne Arundel County to bring suit against Benjamin J. Finkle the collector of direct taxes for 1841 & 1842.

Oct 4th 1843

The Governor to day issued a warrant to the Sheriff of Allegany County commanding him to surrender Andrew Collins to the agent of the State of Virginia as a fugitive from the justice of said State, he having been demanded as such by the Governor thereof.

Oct 11th 1843.

The Governor to day granted the following Nolle Prosequi

"State of Maryland, To wit:

Whereas, a certain Edward Worthington late of Baltimore City stands charged by indictment of the Grand Jury of the said City with assaulting and beating Samuel Jagart with intent to kill; And whereas, the said Edward Worthington has been recommended to Executive clemency by several respectable persons,

Now Therefore, I, Francis Thomas Governor of the State of Maryland, do hereby grant a Nolle Prosequi to the said Edward Worthington on account of the aforesaid offence, upon payment of the costs accrued upon said indictment, and other proceedings if any, and order and direct that all further proceedings against him on the indictment aforesaid, do cease and determine, upon payment of the costs aforesaid, and that no further prosecutions be had or carried on against him for or on account of said offence
