The Governor to day issued the following requisition:

"State of Maryland, - to wit:

J. Francis Thomas, Governor of the State of Maryland

To His Excellency The Governor of Pennsylvania.

It appears by the annexed Paper, duly authenticated according to the laws of this state, that Otto Snyder and his wife Margaret Snyder stand charged on Presentment of the Grand Inquest of Washington, Maryland, with the crime of enticing and persuading, aiding and abetting to run away from their master one negro man, the property of Michael Stringley, and one colored female servant and two children, the property of Jacob Hollingsworth some time in January last 1843, and it has been represented to me that they have fled from the justice of this state, and have taken refuge within the state of Pennsylvania.

Now therefore, Pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution and laws of the United States in such case made and provided, I do hereby request that the said Otto Snyder and his wife Margaret Snyder to be apprehended and delivered to William Feanes who is hereby duly authorized to receive and convey them to the state of Maryland, there to be dealt with according to law.

In Witness Whereof, I have hereunto affixed my name and the Great Seal of the State, this Eleventh day of October in the year of Our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and forty three.
