Now Therefore, I, Francis Thomas, Governor of the state of Maryland, do hereby grant a *Nolle Prosequi* to the said John I. Sain on account of the aforesaid offence, upon payment of the costs accrued upon said presentment, and other proceedings, if any, and order and direct that all further proceedings against him on the presentment aforesaid, do cease and determine, upon payment of the costs aforesaid, and that no further prosecution be had or carried on against him for or on account of said offence.

The Governor omitted, to day, two fines of ten dollars each imposed upon Moses Conason by Anne Arundel County Court, at April term 1843, for selling and allowing liquor to be drunk on his premises.

October 30<sup>th</sup> 1843.

The Governor to day granted the following *Nolle Prosequi*

"State of Maryland, to Wit:

Whereas, a certain Gerald Boursey, late of Queen Anne's County, Maryland, stands charged by presentment of the Grand Jury of the said County, with the offences, of uttering and publishing libels on the Rev. John Palmer Robinson, and W. W. Nichols (2 cases see record); And Whereas, the said Gerald Boursey has been recommended to Executive clemency by a very large number of respectable citizens of Queen Anne's County, who represent, that no good could result from the prosecution of the said Gerald Boursey, but that on the contrary, serious injury would be the consequence of it, inasmuch as the investigation would be, necessarily, of a private and delicate nature; and further, that the parties libeled, have no desire for his prosecution.

Now Therefore, I, Francis Thomas, Governor of the state of Maryland, do hereby grant a *Nolle Prosequi* to the said Gerald Boursey on account of the aforesaid offences, upon payment of the costs accrued upon said presentment, and other proceedings, if any, and order and direct that all further proceedings against him on the presentment aforesaid, do cease and determine, upon payment of the costs aforesaid, and that no further prosecution be had or carried on against him for or on account of said offences.
