November 4<sup>th</sup> 1843

This day remitted a fine of ten dollars which was imposed upon Thomas Frost by Judges King of Bal-  
timore City for selling paper in the streets without a license as a Hawker and Pedlar.

November 4<sup>th</sup> 1843

The Governor having received the record in the case of the State of Maryland against Negro  
Daniel, signed and forwarded to the Sheriff of Prince George's County, a writ warrant  
for the execution of said Negro Daniel, the said warrant being in the following words,  
"The State of Maryland, To the Sheriff of Prince George's County, Greeting.

Whereas Negro Daniel, slave of Samuel Hamilton late of Prince George's County,  
was convicted in the County Court of Prince George's County, at October term 1843 of  
the murder of one John Smith, and the said court sentenced him to be hung  
by the neck until he be dead.

Now, therefore, there are to will and require, as also to charge and  
command you, that on or before twelve of the clock, on Friday, the twenty fourth day of  
November 1843, you take the said Negro Daniel from your Prison, and him safely  
convey to the Gallows in the County aforesaid, the place of the execution of Male  
factors, and there the said Negro Daniel hang by the neck until he be dead:  
For all which this shall be your sufficient power and authority.

Given under my hand, and the Great Seal of the State of Maryland,  
this fourth day of November, in the year of our Lord eighteen  
hundred and forty three and of the independence of the  
United States the sixty seventh.

November 24<sup>th</sup> 1843

The Governor to day on the recommendation of the Judges of Baltimore City Court, remitted the fines imposed  
by Baltimore City Court at October term 1843 upon John Hester, George McCutcheon, Martin  
Furningham and Samuel Parsons for Huckleberry wood contrary to act of Assembly.

November 25<sup>th</sup> 1843

The Governor to day pardoned David Jones who was convicted in Baltimore City Court at October term 1843 of an
