The Governor to day granted the following Writ Habeas Corpus.

"State of Maryland, S. Writ.

Whereas, a certain Isaac C. Anderson late of Howard district, Anne Arundel County, stands charged by indictment of the Grand Jury of the said district with the crime of an assault with intent to kill, ^{and murder} one Sobleant; And whereas, the said Isaac C. Anderson has been recommended to Executive clemency by a number of respectable citizens of Anne Arundel County, and by a large majority of the twenty two members of the Grand Jury who found the bill against him, who state that if they were members of a petit jury to try him on said indictment, that they would acquit him on the testimony adduced before them against him, and further, that since the finding of the bill of indictment they have learned circumstances connected with the case, which had they known before would have induced them to have ignored said bill of indictment.

Now, Therefore, I, Francis Thomas Governor of the State of Maryland, do hereby grant a Writ Habeas Corpus to the said Isaac C. Anderson on account of the aforesaid offence, upon payment of the costs accrued upon said indictment and other proceedings, if any, and order and direct that all further proceedings against him on the indictment aforesaid, do cease and determine, upon payment of the costs aforesaid, and that no further prosecution be had or carried on against him for or on account of said offence.

The Governor having this day received the record of the case of the State vs Adam Horn alias Andrew Hillman convicted in Baltimore County Court of Muries, issued the following warrant.

"The State of Maryland, To the Sheriff of Baltimore County greeting.

Whereas Adam Horn otherwise called Andrew Hillman late of Baltimore County was convicted in the County Court of Baltimore County at November term A. D. 1843 of the murder of One Malinda Horn, and the said Court sentenced him to be hung by the neck until he be dead.

Now, Therefore, there are to visit and require, as also to charge and command you, that on or before twelve of the clock, on Friday the twenty second day of December, instant, you take the said Adam Horn otherwise called Andrew Hillman from your Prison, and him safely convey to the Gallows in the County aforesaid, the place of ^{the} execution of Malefactors, and there the said Adam Horn, otherwise called Andrew Hillman hang by the neck until he be dead: In all which this shall be your sufficient power and
