The Governor to day issued the following requisition:

State of Maryland, - To His P.

I, Francis Thomas, Governor of the State of Maryland.

To His Excellency the Governor of Virginia

It appears by the Annexed Papers, duly authenticated according to the laws of this State, that a certain Benjamin C. Dixon, and a certain Rowen M. Nail, stand charged on presentments of the Grand Inquest for the body of Worcester County, with breaking into the house of Samuel Dillingham and feloniously stealing and carrying away his negro slaves, and it has been represented to me that they have fled from the justice of this State, and have taken refuge within the State of Virginia.

Now therefore, Pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution and Laws of the United States in such case made and provided, I do hereby request that the said Benjamin C. Dixon, and Rowen M. Nail to be apprehended and delivered to Simon Hays of Baltimore City who is hereby duly authorized to receive and convey them to the State of Maryland then to be dealt with according to law.

In Witness Whereof, I have hereunto affixed my name and the Great Seal of the State, this seventeenth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty four.
