This day the Governor made the nominations of the civil officers of the State

January 29<sup>th</sup> 1844

This day the Governor remitted the fine of fifteen dollars imposed upon Peter Suter of Washington County at the November Term 1843 of said County Court for selling goods without a license.

January 30<sup>th</sup> 1844

This day the Governor sent the following message to the General Assembly

To the Honorable

The General Assembly:

Herewith submit for the consideration of the General Assembly, a letter received from the State Wharfinger in the city of Baltimore. From it, it will appear, that the occupants of the wharf property of the State, have been accustomed to use such property for the sale of fire wood

By a recent decision of Baltimore city Court, it has been decided, that such use is in violation of the Act of Assembly. In as much as the Legislature have heretofore passed a special law releasing two of the owners of private wharves from the operation of the provisions of this act of Assembly, it may be well to enquire whether it would not be proper to modify the existing law so as to place the State, as well as other individual owners of wharf property, in the same condition as that of the two who have been released

January 31<sup>st</sup> 1844

This day the Governor made the nominations of the civil officers for Harford County

February 1<sup>st</sup> 1844

This day the Governor received a communication from the Senate, advising that the Senate advised and consented to the appointment severally of civil officers for Howard District agreeably to the list of nominations submitted on the 5<sup>th</sup> of January last; and also advised and consented to the appointment severally of civil officers for Frederick County agreeably to the list of nominations submitted on the 22<sup>nd</sup> of January last except certain persons to be Justices of the District Courts which he for consideration.

February 3<sup>rd</sup> 1844

This day the Governor received a communication from the Senate advising, that the Senate advised and consented to the appointment severally of civil officers for Baltimore city agreeably to the list of nominations submitted on the 20<sup>th</sup> of January last; and also advised and consented to the appointment severally of civil officers for Montgomery County,
