

February 10th 1844

This day the Governor received a communication from the Senate advising that the Senate had advised and consented to the appointment of Charles F. Kalkman Justice of the 1st Election District Court of Baltimore county; also to the appointment of William Tolson and Richard D. Bowling Judges of the 6th Election District Court of Prince George's County; also to the appointment of William Tolson, Richard D. Bowling, Devolt Swenson and Edward H. Edlin Justices of the Peace for Prince George's County; and also to the appointment of John H. J. Magruder State Librarian.

February 12th 1844

This day the Governor remitted a fine of \$50. imposed on James M. Buchanan by Baltimore city court at June Term 1842 for an assault and battery on Thomas S. Beach,

The Governor this day pardoned Thomas Vines of Baltimore city and remitted the fine of \$20. on condition that he give security to keep the peace for twelve months in the sum of \$100.

The Governor this day remitted one half of the fine imposed on Benjamin Phipps, Richard Phipps, Zachariah McConey, Benjamin E. Jones and Joseph Fowler each, at the October Term 1843 of Anne Arundel County Court for an assault and battery on Knock Shekel

February 13th 1844

The Governor this day remitted the two fines imposed on William Fowler by Howard District of Anne Arundel County Court at September Term 1843 for selling dry goods without a license.

The Governor made the nomination of civil officers for Saint Mary's County, this day

February 15th 1844

The Governor appointed this day Matthias E. Bartgiss, Michael Byrne, and Patrick O'Neil Visitors of St. John's Literary Institution in the Town of Frederick and directed commissions to be issued to them and they were issued accordingly.

February 16th 1844

The Governor this day pardoned William Thompson (see "record of pardons")

February 19th 1844

The Governor this day made the nominations for Carroll County

The Governor this day nominated John Carroll LeGrand to be associate Judge of the 6th Judicial District of Maryland vice Richard B. Magruder deceased

February 20th 1844

This day the Governor made the nominations of civil officers for Worcester County; also for Commissioners of Lotteries, also for Board Corder in the Town of St. Michael in Talbot County.

This day the Governor received a communication from the Senate advising him that the Senate advise and consent to the appointments severally of civil officers for Alleghany County, agreeably to the list of nominations submitted on the 22nd of January last except the nomination of Henry M. Pettit to be Surveyor, which lies for consideration; also except the nominations of Peter Pastors, Murray Hayer
