This day the Governor remitted the fine of \$10. imposed on Richard McCauley by James Martin a Justice of the peace in Howard District for selling as a Hawker or Pedlar without a license

February 24th 1844

This day the Governor sent certain nominations to the Senate for Auctioneers, Coroner of Washington County, Justices of the peace for several Counties (see "record of nominations")

February 24th 1844

This day Military commissions were delivered to the Adjutant General for Col. Joseph G. Harrison Lieut. Col. John Woods and Major Charles D. Hodges of the 2nd Regiment of U. S. and Felix S. Coskeny as Surgeon of the 26th Regiment of U. S.

February 26th 1844

This day the Governor made the nominations for Dorchester County

February 27th 1844

This day the Governor made the nominations for Caroline County

This day the Governor pardoned George T. Turner, Peter Brady and Daniel Wilson (see "record of pardons")

February 28th 1844

This day the Governor sent the following message to the General Assembly:
