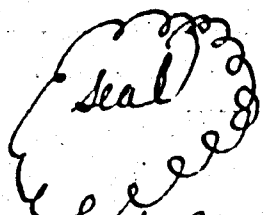
This day the Governor received an oral communication from the Senate through Mr. Nicholson Clerk advising him that the Senate advised and consented to the appointment of John Carroll Le Grand to be associate Judge of the Sixth Judicial District; and a commission was issued directed to him in the words following to wit:

State of Maryland To John Carroll Le Grand. Greeting:

Francis Thomas

Be it known that reposing great trust and confidence in your integrity and sound legal knowledge you are appointed and assigned associate Judge of the Sixth Judicial District, to do equal right and justice according to law in every case in which you shall act as Judge freely without sale, fully without any denial, and speedily without delay; and you are to execute the said office of Judge justly, honestly, diligently, and faithfully according to law; and you are to hold and execute the said office for and during good behavior, and removable only in the manner prescribed by the Constitution and form of Government.

Given under the Seal of the State of Maryland the second day of March in the year Eighteen hundred and forty four

March 1st William P. Mills and Hugh Dowling to be Auctioneers agreeably to the nominations

February 19th John Carroll Le Grand to be associate Judge of the 6th Judicial District agreeably to the nomination.
