

State that Basil Carter, late of this State, has been indicted by the Grand Jury of Prince Georges County Court, at April Term 1844 of said Court, for breaking open and entering the Store House of John W. Ward and then and there stealing, taking and carrying away, goods, wares, and Merchandise, the property of said John W. Ward to the amount of fifty dollars current money: and also that George Payne late of said State has been indicted by the Grand Jury of said County for feloniously stealing, taking and carrying away one bag more of the value of seventy five dollars current money, the property of Allen F. Bowie of said County, and it has been represented to me that they have fled from the Justice of this State, and have taken refuge in the District of Columbia:

Now Therefore in pursuance of the Constitution and Laws of the United States in such case made and provided, I do hereby request that the said Basil Carter, and George Payne be apprehended and delivered to Thomas Baldwin, who is hereby duly authorized to receive and convey them to the State of Maryland, there to be dealt with according to law.

This day the Governor issued the following Requisition,

I Francis Thomas, Governor of the State of Maryland,

To the Honorable William Branch, Chief Judge of the Circuit Court of the United States for the District of Columbia.

It appears by the annexed papers duly authenticated according to the laws of this State, that James Reddin, late of said State, has been indicted by the Grand Jury of Prince Georges County Court, at April Term 1844 of said Court, for receiving stolen goods, being twenty dollars in American gold, knowing the said twenty dollars to have been feloniously stolen; and it has been represented to me that he has fled from the justice of this State, and has taken refuge within the District of Columbia

Now therefore pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution and Laws of the United States in such case made and provided, I do hereby request that the said James Reddin be apprehended and delivered to Thomas Baldwin, who is hereby duly authorized to receive and convey him to the State of Maryland, there to be dealt with according to law.
