

April 8th 1844.

This day the Governor issued the following Requisition,

I Francis Thomas, Governor of the State of Maryland,

The Honorable William Cranch, Chief Judge of the Circuit Court of the United States for the District of Columbia:

It appears by the annexed papers duly authenticated according to the laws of this State, that Clement Brooks, alias Clew, a free man of colour, late of this State, has been indicted by the Grand Jury of Prince George's County Court, at April Term 1844 of said Court for enticing, persuading, and assisting a certain negro Gentry, the proper slave of one Eli S. Baldwin, of said County and State to run away from said Eli S. Baldwin, and it has been represented to me that said Clew has fled from the justice of this State, and has taken refuge within the District of Columbia;

Now therefore, pursuant to the provisions of the Constitution and Laws of the United States in such case made and provided, I do hereby request that the said Clew be apprehended and delivered to Thomas Baldwin, who is hereby duly authorized to receive and convey him to the State of Maryland, there to be dealt with according to law.

In witness whereof I have hereunto affixed my name and the Great Seal of the State this eighth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty four.

April 9th 1844

This day the Governor released the Recognizance forfeited by John L. Dancy for his appearance in Prince George's County: the same being recommended by the Judges of the Court, and the Deputy Attorney General.

April 15th 1844.

This day the Governor remitted the fine imposed by Baltimore County Court upon Perkins, of ten dollars, for violating the act relating to Hawkers and Peddlers.

April 15th 1844

This day the Governor remitted the fine of Eli S. Baldwin and George Crawford, on forfeited recognizance, as security for the appearance of J. L. Dancy in Prince George's County Court.

April 15th 1844

This day the Governor remitted the fine imposed on John Loftus of eighteen dollars, by Allegany County at October Term 1844 for selling liquor without license.
