

April 19<sup>th</sup> 1844

This day the Governor granted a Pardon to Rosanna Herbert, convicted in Baltimore County Court, at April Term 1844 of Felony (for pardon, see Record of Pardons)

April 19<sup>th</sup> 1844

This day the Governor granted a pardon to James Reddin, convicted in Prince George's County Court, at April Term 1844, of receiving stolen goods, knowing them to be stolen. (For pardon, see Record of Pardons)

April 23<sup>rd</sup> 1844

This day the Governor granted a pardon to Orsey Israel, convicted in Baltimore County Court, at April Term 1844 of Felony (for Pardon see Record of Pardons)

April 25<sup>th</sup> 1844

This day the Governor granted a pardon to Elijah Peacock, convicted on Indictment in Baltimore County Court, at April Term 1844, of receiving stolen goods knowing them to be stolen (for pardon see Record of Pardons)

April 30<sup>th</sup> 1844

This day the Governor granted a pardon to James Ennis, convicted in Baltimore County Court, at April Term 1844, of Felony (for pardon see Record of Pardons)

May 10<sup>th</sup> 1844

The Governor this day remitted the recognizance entered into by John George Voss in the sum of \$200 for the appearance of George Weissmiller in Baltimore City Court at February Term 1844, and which was forfeited.

May 10<sup>th</sup> 1844

The Governor this day remitted the fine of \$12, imposed on Abraham Pettinger by Washington County Court, for violation of the Act relating to Hawkers and Pedlars.

May 20<sup>th</sup> 1844

The Governor this day remitted the fine imposed by Carroll County Court at April Term 1844, for selling liquor with license.

May 20<sup>th</sup> 1844

This day the Governor issued the following Order to the Sheriff of Baltimore County-

To the Sheriff of Baltimore County, Greeting

Whereas it appears from certain documents transmitted to me by his Excellency the Governor of Virginia that Herman Gleason stands charged with having feloniously broken and entered the store house of Jesse Gover and son of Loudon County in said State, and having therefrom feloniously taken and carried away certain goods, wares, and merchandise, and money to the value of five dollars, the same being the proper goods and chattels of said Jesse Gover and son, and that having fled from the justice of that State he has taken refuge in the State of Maryland, and whereas his Excellency has demanded him as a fugitive from justice;

Now Therefore these are to authorize you to cause the said Herman
