

May 28<sup>th</sup> 1844

This day the Governor released the Fine of sixteen dollars imposed upon Joseph Keefer by Carroll County Court at April Term 1844, for selling liquor without license.

May 31<sup>st</sup> 1844

This day the Governor released the Fine of ten dollars imposed upon Felix McKenna by James Blair Esq. a Justice of Peace for the City of Baltimore, for violation of the Act relating to Hawkers and Peddlers.

June 3<sup>o</sup> 1844

This day the Governor issued the following Order to the Jailor of Frederick County, *ps.*

To the Jailor of Frederick County, Greeting:

Whereas it appears to me by certain documents transmitted to me by his Excellency the Governor of Pennsylvania, that a certain Joseph Sweikaffer stands charged in the County of Adams, and the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, with the crime of Burglary, and that having fled from the Justice of that State, he has taken refuge in the State of Maryland, and it appearing that he is now in your custody; and Whereas his Excellency has demanded him as a fugitive from Justice, Now Therefore these are to authorize you to deliver the said Joseph Sweikaffer to Conrad Weaver, the Agent appointed by His Excellency the Governor of Pennsylvania to receive and convey him to the said State—the said Agent first paying all the Costs and Charges of the arrest and detention of the said Joseph Sweikaffer.

For all which this shall be your sufficient warrant and authority.

Given under my hand and the Great Seal of the State of Maryland on this third day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty four.

This day the Governor granted a Passport to Conrad Weaver, the Agent appointed by His Excellency the Governor of Pennsylvania, to receive and convey to that State Joseph Sweikaffer charged with Burglary in the County of Adams, and State of Pennsylvania.

June 5<sup>th</sup> 1844

This day the Governor issued the following Order to the Jailor of Baltimore County *ps.*

Whereas it appears by certain documents transmitted to me by His Excellency the Governor of Pennsylvania that a certain Robert Barber stands charged with obtaining money under false statements and false pretences, which according to the Laws of Pennsylvania is a crime punished by imprisonment in the Penitentiary, and that having fled from the justice of that State he has taken refuge in the State of Maryland, and it appearing that he is now in your custody; and Whereas his
